

More good news, thanks to the hard work of our members our list of usable Solo sites has grown immensely in the last few years. We've gone from having years with only a single site for the entire season to having a current list that includes the Oswego County EVOC track, Cayuga Community College, Lafayette Motorsport Park (ex. Cherry Valley) and, for the 2018 season, it looks like Seneca Army Depot will be back on the calendar, along with the new Pineview Run Auto & Country Club.

On a serious note, it is absolutely critical we all remember that we are guests at these sites and need to be on our best behavior. That means picking up after ourselves and leaving the site better than when we found it, and most importantly, no reckless driving to and from the event.



The Club is looking at options to replace our aging Solo timing system. The current system is over 20 years old. We have been maintaining it and it has been working well most of the time. The preferred replacement would be a wireless system to eliminate running cables between the start and finish lines and the timing trailer. However, input from the neighboring Regions is that the wireless systems have their own set of unique problems. This will be an ongoing investigation. In the mean time we will continue to make repairs to the existing system.

Solo trailer – as you've probably heard and seen, we purchased a 16 foot trailer to replace our aging Solo van. However, after a season of being towed and disguised as a standard big white box with wheels, our trailer sides need SCCA, CNY Region, and most importantly, sponsor logo's to cover all that blank surface. Central New York Region Member Dave Cardillo, 2017 NYSRRC Driver of the Year and Eddie Whitmore/John Magee Memorial Trophy Recipient

Central New York Region member Dave Cardillo was voted the 2017 New York State Road Racing Championship (NYSRRC) Driver of the Year. In addition, he was the recipient of the Eddie Whitmore/John Magee Memorial Trophy, which is given to the formula vee driver who embodies the skill, sportsmanship, and spirit of racing. The Eddie Whitmore/John Magee Memorial Trophy is only given out when the Northeast formula vee community agrees there is a driver who meets the criteria for the honor. "I'm humbled and honored to be chosen for these awards" Dave said. "It's a great way to end this season."

Dave's 2017 road racing season results certainly merit the accolades he's received. He won the formula vee class in two different road racing series: the NYSRRC and the Northeast Division Road Racing Championship (NEDRRC). In addition to winning the formula vee class in the NYSRRC, he was also the NYSRRC overall series Champion, leading hundreds of other drivers in dozens of car classes in points. Out of the 13 races Dave participated in this season, he won 7 poles, had 8 race wins and two 2nd place podium finishes.

This season was Dave's second full road racing season in a formula vee. In fact, it's his second full season racing in anything. A few years ago, with no racing background and an interest in cars, Dave and his wife attended a Skip Barber one day driving

school. "I knew immediately I wanted to drive cars competitively." Dave continued his racing education by attending Skip Barber's three-day racing school, which earned him his SCCA full competition license. He then attended their advanced car control clinic. "After going to Skip Barber I figured it was time to buy a car. But I wasn't sure what class of car I wanted. Ed Zebrowski invited

me to a race weekend at Watkins Glen as a guest of the Glen Region. Ed took me around the paddock and introduced me to a lot of drivers. After that weekend, it was pretty clear if I wanted to improve my driving I should start racing in a formula vee." Dave bought a formula vee and started racing in the Northeast the following season. "I learned pretty quickly how much of a team sport road racing is. I've had tremendous support from my wife/crew chief Tracie. She's been at every race weekend. Gary Kittell, a top national level formula vee driver, has given me invaluable driver coaching and mechanical/technical help. The whole formula vee

community has been there as well with advice, spare parts, or a helping hand." Dave attributes his success to all of the help he has had. "Without everyone's help and support, I'd still be working on the car in my garage at home."

The 2018 season is going to be chock full of racing for Dave. He plans on continuing to race in multiple race series in the Northeast in his formula vee as well as giving ChumpCar a try. "I'm having a lot of fun road racing and I'm looking forward to next season."
