

They are equipped with Comer 50cc engines, and are perfect for learning. They also have one "cadet" kart with



an 80cc Comer engine, for slightly larger kids. In this friendly, laid-back environment, we've seen great progress in car control skills, and awareness. It looks like a very promising venue for preparing kids for either wheel-to-wheel racing in karts, or autocrossing in SCCA Formula Junior classes, or both. Plus, there are rental karts available for adult "kids", which makes the day fun for kids and parents alike. We're lucky to have a facility like this so convenient to the Syracuse area.

We also expect this to be the last print issue of the Snarling Exhaust. So, please make sure that the membership chairman has your current e-mail address. And, by all means, if you don't have e-mail access, let us know. So far, nobody has contacted the club officers about this, so the assumption is that all recipients of this newsletter have access to the internet. If that's not true, now would be a good time to speak up.
















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First Ever CNYR SCCA Karting Invitational

The 1st CNYR-SCCA Go-Kart Invitational was held on Wednesday, August 19 at the legendary Cherry Valley Motorsports Park, in scenic Lafayette, NY.

Eleven competitors took to the track in what turned out to be a competitive, albeit controversial, night of racing, entertainment and bravado.

We started by drawing black or white poker chips from a hat, and randomly separating into 2 groups. Each group was given the opportunity to take 5 practice laps to familiarize themselves with the track, and the unique handling characteristics of a go-kart. Following practice each group competed in a 10 lap "heat" race in which the top 3 competitors qualified for the feature race. We then had a second chance, 6 lap heat race, for all the competitors (i.e. losers), with the winner advancing to the feature.

The final competitors from the black group were: (1) Mike Donofrio; (2) Ed Heffron; and (3) Scott Newton. From the white group (1) Jay Cartini; (2) Karl Hughes; and (3) Chip Davis. From the 2nd chance group we were joined by Wes Davis.

We had the unique opportunity to have a professional flagger in attendance who took control of the situation after he quickly realized that he had too much driving skill to waste on us. A special thank-you goes out to Bob Holcomb for dealing with all the logistics, rules, and danger of flagging during the races that evening.

All the racing was pretty much what we expected. There was some minor contact, but no more than there should have been, except for a few instances in the feature race. It appears that for whatever reason, Wes Davis decided to take his father, Chip, out of contention. Why he would take out the hand that not only feeds him, but pays for his tuition, is anyone's guess. But as they say, rubbin' is racin'. I'm sure that was an interesting ride home. In another instance we were all sort of blessed by a stroke of good luck: for some unknown reason, Ed Heffron managed to t-bone Scott Newton, and

had to drop out of the race due to mechanical failure.

The feature was won by Karl Hughes, followed by Scott Newton, Jay Cartini, Chip Davis, Mike Donofrio (1), Wes Davis(2), and Ed Heffron (DNF).

- (1) A protest was filed immediately after the conclusion of the race regarding whether or not Mike Donofrio jumped the start and illegally passed all competitors before reaching the starting line. The CNYRSCCA Go-Kart Committee reviewed the protest and determined that it was true. This has resulted in a black flag penalty stripping him of his victory.
- (2) The CNYRSCCA Go-Kart Committee has reviewed Wes Davis's overly aggressive driving which resulted in his father Chip (a CNYR-SCCA Solo Sponsor) to spin out. The CNYRSCCA Go-Kart Committee has ruled that the spin out was directly related to the intentional contact by Wes Davis and has resulted in a black flag ruling.

"All racing was monitored under the supervision of the **CNYRSCCA** Committee. All challenges to the rulings of the CNYRSCCA Go-Kart Committee must submitted in writing no later than 1 hour after the ruling has been made to be considered for appeal. All appeals must be accompanied by a substantial monetary gratuity to even be The CNYRSCCA Go-Kart acknowledged. Committee has the right to adjust, modify, amend, change, eliminate or add any rule it deems necessary."

Now that people have had the opportunity to try what go-karting is all about it would be interesting to get some more people out there competing. The cost was somewhat reasonable, between \$40-\$60 depending on how much racing you did. We had a lot of fun and will do it again.

So I guess the next question is.....racing anyone????


