## TIPS FROM THE CONE ZONE

A series of tips from the more successful Solo II drivers for the less experienced drivers and newbies. Lee Hidy graciously agreed to be interviewed.

#### Name: Lee Hidy

Car make/year/class: Black 1989 Mini Sprint powered by a Yamaha FJ 1200 motor. The mini sprint runs in AM.

What do you love about your autocross ride? Lee is enjoying the challenge of applying what he learned with his previous ride of 16 years (sprint car) to his new ride this year. He also appreciates its softer ride and the fact that its easier to push around the paddock area.

Daily driver? He drives a black 1986 Fiero GT with about 85,000 miles on the odometer.

Membership: Lee has been a member of the SCCA and the CNY Club for 42 years!

Number of Solo II events last year: Six

Other hobbies: He crews on a racing sailboat captained by his wife Alice.

What do you do in off season? Lee enjoys working out in the gym about five times a week. He also snowshoes.

One thing about you that might surprise other club members? Lee has built a lap dulcimer and is trying to learn how to play it.

Most important tip to newbies? Your car tends to go where you are looking. Look ahead ... Lee actually tries to look one if not two turns ahead when he's out on the course.

Prerace breakfast? He usually doesn't eat breakfast ... or lunch.

Most important thing regarding walking course? Lee carefully examines the entrance and exit for each turn. In most cases, he tries to find and visualize a constant radius racing line. He also paces off the distance between cones in slaloms. Sometimes course designers can stretch distances in back end of slalom which can provide the opportunity to accelerate.

Between runs? He tries not to focus on errors. He tries to replay in his mind a visualization of how he would like to drive the entire course. Likes to imagine how the course flows .

How do you practice between autocrosses? Lee believes that street driving at safe speeds provides numerous opportunities for improvement. For example, concentrating on proper lines on Driving in the snow is a great time to develop your overall sensitivity to how your car feels as it approaches it's braking and turning limits. entrance /exit ramps.



What do you focus on/think about right before you start a run? He likes to observe the how the driver in front of him tackles the initial turns of the course. Lee concentrates on correct RPM's for launching the car.

What do you focus on /think about right after you finish a run? He picks several sections of the course where he believes he could have gone faster. Then he incorporates the driving changes he will try and make into a modified visualization of how he will drive the course next time.

Anything different in driving on wet course? Lee admits to not liking to drive his open cockpit car with no fenders in the rain. It's not fun.

What aspect of your driving are you focusing on for improvement this year? Lee is sorting out and learning how to drive a brand new car. He's getting used to shifting gears again.

Favorite type of professional auto racing / favorite driver? He is not a rabid fan of current auto racing. Lee believes that 1950's Formula 1 remains the golden era of auto racing. Juan Manual Fangio (past five time world champion) remains his favorite driver.

Dream ride: Lee would stick with his mini sprint for competition (although he dreams about swapping in a Harley engine.) He'd love to have a second mini sprint (without the wings and with fenders) for street use!

Final words: Lee is not a big fan of the PAX index. He believes a well designed course should not favor any particular type of car. In the end it's all about the fun of driving.

Re: National Membership Dues

After almost four years since the last increase in National dues, the SCCA Board of Directors approved increases of \$5 for Individual memberships, \$10 for Family memberships, and \$5 for Spouse memberships. The dues for FirstGear and Military memberships are unchanged. Current members whose membership expires before February 1 may renew at the old rate. Members with a February or later expiration date will be sent renewal notices reflecting the new rate. The effective date for new members is February 1.

We will continue to accept membership applications from the Get Real Fast brochure at the old rate until the supply is exhausted. The decision to accept these applications at the old price will not impact the dues amount the region receives.

The new National dues price for Individual memberships is \$60, Family memberships are \$95, and Spouse memberships are \$20.

While no dues increase is ever welcomed by the membership, by streamlining its business and increasing revenue in areas of sponsorship and advertising, SCCA has been able to maintain a dues structure that has increased less than the cost of living increases in the last four years.
