






Lots of TSD rally stuff in this month's issue. The CNYIRA Beginner's Rally is still planned for June 5. Dr. Devio has issued preliminary info on the "Route Of All Evil", and we also have route instructions from the 2nd rally of the 1976 CNYR Rally Championship Series, "The Incredible Swamp Monster".

Bob Holcomb brings us a report on the 22nd Annual RSI Motorsports Safety Seminar at Watkins Glen, along with photos of the track renovations.

I've started digging into past issues of the Snarling, which is very entertaining. Much information will be scanned and published in upcoming issues, including photos of many current members back when they had hair.

The Incredible Swamp Monster route instructions came to me via a co-worker who was active in TSD rallying with CNYR in the '70s. Fascinating stuff when compared with the tulip diagram route instructions commonly used today.

The Solo season has started, as has the rallycross season. Look for results in these pages, and hopefully some photos as well.

A new development for the Solo program is the "Pro" class. This is an indexed class for those drivers who want to measure themselves against other experienced competitors. Finger Lakes Region is doing the same thing this year. Judging by the participation at the first event, it should be a lively contest this season. The Pro class is not mandatory. Drivers who prefer to can still run in their respective classes, or in the indexed Novice class.

The first Solo event of the season went well, considering the forecast was for rain all day. The rain held off until the last set of runs for the last group, so most everybody got their runs in on dry pavement. The overall PAX winner was Heather Everett of WNYR, driving Mike Potocki's Shelby. In fact, WNYR swept the top five spots in the Pro class. I'd say that's a drop of the gauntlet for CNYR drivers – I guess we'd better get our acts together, eh? I'd also say that it might be worth watching for Heather's name in National Tour and Pro Solo results this season.



There is a two-day Solo planned in conjunction with the Glen Region at Seneca Army Depot again this year. If you haven't been to SeAD, and if you haven't attended a two-day event there, seriously consider running this year. A large group of competitors camp at nearby Sampson State Park each year, so it's a great social weekend as well. Activities Chair Rob Sgarlata mentioned last year that he'd be willing to help coordinate camping for that weekend this year, so let him know if you're interested.

Also, if you've never been to a national-level Solo event, do consider attending the National Tour this year at SeAD. It's a great chance to see some excellent drivers in action, and to see how a national-caliber event is run. Careful, though – you may find you like it. And that can lead to a trip to Lincoln, Nebraska in September...



CALL TO ORDER:

Beginner's TSD Rally June 6

On June 6th the Central New York Ice Racing Association (CNYIRA) will be putting on an entry level Time, Speed, Distance (TSD) Rally.



No, there will be no ice that day as far as we can predict. CNYIRA is made up of a bunch of motorsports enthusiasts who keep up their skill in the winter by racing on the frozen lakes around central New York during the winter season.

All auto enthusiasts are welcome at this event. It will be enjoyable enough for experienced rallyists while at the same time it will be geared more towards beginners who would like to find out just how much fun a TSD Rally can be. Of course the veteran rallyists can always use some practice to keep that skill level up, while this is a great place for novice rallyists to start. The entry fee is only \$20.

The CNYIRA June 6th TSD Rally will be starting and finishing at the Quaker Steak and Lube on Walters Road in Solvay, NY. Registration will be open from noon until 1:15 PM. There will be a short rally school at 12:30 PM and a mandatory driver's meeting at 1:15. The first car will leave the start at 1:30 PM. The event will cover about 120 miles and take about 3-1/2 to 4 hours to complete. This will be a standard TSD Rally - no gimmicks, scavenger hunts, or trick questions.

TSD Rallies are traversed over public roads within the legal speed limit. The challenge is to drive on time, arriving at points along the route neither early nor late (it's NOT a race). The competition here is against the clock and doing the route precisely at speed, not being the fastest. Each team needs a simple watch which can be synchronized to match official time, a working odometer, as well as something to write on and with.

Cars will start at one minute intervals. The first section, a short 10-15 mile route, is called the "Odometer Calibration Zone," and is used to calibrate the rally car's odometer to the official mileage used to measure the course by the Rallymaster. After this section, the competition really begins, as you must follow the course using the instructions in the route book, as well as the general instructions that govern the rally. Meanwhile, you must also stay on time, based on the average speeds given in the instructions at various points through the routes.

A rally is really a contest of precision. At various points, unknown to the competitors, timing controls (checkpoints) will be encountered. Since the Rallymaster knows the exact distance and speeds you should have traveled to

reach the checkpoint, the "perfect time" of arrival can be calculated. You are timed at the moment you reach the control, and will receive penalty points for arriving either early OR late. You are then given information about the last leg, as well as a time to start the next leg, and a clean start to challenge the clock. This is a contest of precision, not a race, and each leg is scored separately. If you are early or late at one control, you cannot make up for it by being late or early at the next. At the conclusion, scores for all legs are totaled, and the lowest score wins (just like golf). Sound easy? Well, just as in golf, it takes practice to get very good scores.

Regardless of how well you score, rallying is a lot of fun if you like to spend time in your car, see some scenery, and spend time with congenial people. Rallies usually end at a location where munchies and beverages are available. You can join the rest of the crowd in discussing how the event went and how you did, while waiting for the final scores to be calculated and trophies to be awarded.

A TSD Rally is a time-speed-distance contest with straight-forward course following. There is never a deliberate attempt to lead the contestant off course, and typically redundant/confirming instructions are provided if there is an apparent opportunity to get lost. Since there is less challenge in staying on course, the competition usually either tests the driver with challenging roads, and/or tests the navigator with precise calculations. A typical National Tour rally with a minimum of 24 controls is won with an average of less than one point per control, and often with less than 10 points total (or a total error for the day of under 6 seconds!).

This is a CNYIRA event, with unofficial assistance from various CNYR SCCA rallyists. Attend, and enjoy a fun rally in Central NY!

Race Services Incorporated 22nd Annual Motorsports Safety Seminar Saturday & Sunday, April 17 & 18, 2010

Race Services Incorporated, in conjunction with Watkins Glen International, holds an annual two day Motorsports Safety Seminar each spring prior to the opening of Watkins Glen International.

Training sessions are held for the following track support groups.

Breakout groups are held and this year the F&C group had at least three CNYR SCCA members attending, Mick Levy, Bob Holcomb and Scott Newton.

Sessions are scheduled from 3 to 3+1/2 hours. Some are class room, some are on track. This year Mother Nature kept things interesting with snow floating in the air on Saturday and fog obscuring visibility on Sunday. Of course, in typical Watkins Glen fashion, as soon as the last session ended on Sunday, the sun appeared and temperatures warmed.

The annual OSHA training session was held on Sunday by DJ Goebel from Corning Glass.

Sunday Steve Ely, WGI track manager, reviewed many of the improvements (some drivers may or may not agree) being made to the track for the 2010 season. These include replacing almost all the gravel trap at the "bus stop" at the end of the back straight with asphalt runoff and NASCAR safer barrier. Some grass will be left just prior to flag station 7 to keep things interesting for the drivers and to help prevent the flaggers from receiving an infamous station 7 stone shower.

The area at the entrance to the boot and the short course NASCAR straight is now wide open with runoff area and safer barriers.

The former gravel trap by turn 10 will have asphalt runoff in the front and gravel further back, while turn 11 will have a new safer barrier wall and radius change all the way to the bridge. Steve Ely said that WGI is the first track to have this new safer barrier design which is being constructed from plans designed by the University of Nebraska.

Unfortunately, the weekend is not held in conjunction with SCCA and you must join RSI to attend. You can check out the RSI web-site at www.riswgi.com for further information.
