

Half way through the race it started to pour and everyone was on slicks. It became a race of attrition. Jimmy Shultz won in his Invader, Mike Brent was second(he started from the back of the pack) and I hung on for third, literally.

This year will be the final Runoffs at Mid Ohio and QRE racing will be looking for its 6th constructors championship and 5th in a row.

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


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
