

Exhaust Pipe Dreams

I'd been looking forward to going to a new track; I've been to the new Lightning Circuit at the new New Jersey Motorsports Park, and that was great! I'd been looking forward to going to Calabogie Motorsports Park in Ontario, Canada, a three-mile, 20-turn course in southern Canada, designed by Alan Wilson, and just a couple of years old. Rising and diving, over and around, on 40 foot wide pristine asphalt. Calabogie is 200 miles north of where I live in Syracuse, but after you get above the border, there's no straight road to the track. And now I know I have to go back to Calabogie, and how to get there (and how not to get there)! The track is worth the trek, folks. At least eight blind corners because of rising and falling terrain, generally good runoff room even though there's lots and lots of trees, in the truly picturesque, rocky track property.

Keep driving; stuff's gonna happen and it's fun as long as the bad stuff doesn't happen too often. I know I'm not alone.


