

My previous column on the search for the next autocross car has generated some interesting discussions. I've gotten feedback from a bunch of people, and apparently I'm not the only autocrosser who obsesses over this.

alternatives have Some interesting floating to the top of the list. Several people have been singing the praises of F500s in FMod. No wings (wings are expensive to purchase, and to develop), relatively cheap tires and wheels, reasonably priced cars, high fun quotient. One interesting rules development is that SCCA is looking at 600cc 4-cycle sport bike engines/transmissions as a drive-train alternative for F500. Yes, these would have traditional gearboxes and clutches. Hmm.

The Mazda Miata keeps popping up too. It has the advantage of being a good-handling package to start with, and lots of people make go-fast parts. In DP trim they are great fun, and all things considered reasonably priced.

You may have noticed that I have not mentioned any stock class, ST or SP cars here. There are lots of fun cars to run at these prep levels, but I'm looking to compete in a car that is much more biased toward the race-prepared end of things. Some of the advantages which matter to me are that many of the prepared and modified cars tend to be smaller and lighter than street-based cars, more responsive and nimble, and gosh, just faster. Having been



lucky enough to get a chance to drive several very well-prepared, and fast, cars over the years, the performance of "real" race cars is very seductive.

This, of course, leads to F125. Karts are a heck of a lot of performance in a pint-sized package. But, there's a rub – SCCA only has one adult kart class, so you have to run a shifter kart to have a hope of being nationally-competitive. Locally, the clutch karts have been great fun (and offer the added perk of being competitive in local road racing.) But, go to a divisional or national event, and the shifters are dominant. And cost about twice as much.

One of my goals, as I mentioned last month, is to end up with a ride which, if not nationally competitive, could be with enough preparation (i.e. money) thrown at it. On the other hand, it's way more fun to run in a class with close competition and a bunch of other drivers. The Pro class creates this, but clutch karts are not good Pro class rides due to their poor performance against the index, which is calculated for shifters.

Decisions, decisions...

From the Assistant R.E., Jon Coffin


Wow! It seems like a lot has been going on lately.

We still have a rallycross and an autocross (or two, night and day) coming up, having run events in August including the autocross enduro which was very well attended (with 48 entries I think.) And the return of "The Route of All Evil" road rally in early October. And elections coming up, for Regional Executive, and Governor too!

In mid-November, there's the Divisional gettogether in Rochester. This mini-convention is not just for region officers, it's open to and entertaining for all members with sessions on most areas of club activity, and a good social event too. If you've never been to one of these get-togethers, look for the details elsewhere in this issue of the Snarling; it's a great opportunity when it's nearby.

Last month I got to go to an event I'd never been to before, the "12 Hours of Nelson" enduro at Nelson Ledges, run by the NorthEast Ohio Region. As in June when I went to the "Devil in the Dark" 12-hour enduro at New Jersey Motorsports Park, I worked as the radio man for a team of Spec Racer Renaults running out of central Pennsylvania.

NJMP is a new and modern facility, and Nelson Ledges is a step back in sports-car time by 20 years or so. It was rustic, and delightful. The track is challenging and fast; I can easily see why drivers like it. In cars that have a top speed of 110 MPH or so, the average lap speed was 90 MPH, so you're not letting off the gas much; and you're not driving in a straight line!





Also coming up for me this month is a return to a Vermont Hillclimb I first ran 40 years ago; it wasn't in the Rabbit, but it was in a VW. I have not run every year since by any means, but I've probably run this hill 20 times (they have a Spring and Fall event) since 1970, so I'll cruise up the hill and see what kind of times I can muster this time around. 


In a close second was Shaun Petrocci and Nathan Walczyk was in third.



You are trying to cram in the final few races, auto- and rallycrosses, catch the Historic weekend at Watkins, and so forth, then put your beloved competition car in mothballs, to magically heal itself of all the ills you have visited upon it over the season about to end.

I, of course, diligently spent the summer crossing off all of the to-do items for the car after last rally season. Er, ah, wrong! Nevertheless, car ready or not, here's where I most likely be this Fall:

RALLYRACING

Rally New York, Sept 10th and 11th, seriously fast rally teams running on a Scout Ranch in the Catskills, a fun three hour ride from Syracuse. You will want to visit the beautiful Bethel Woods Arts Center and Museum two miles north, built to recognize my visit to the Woodstock Festival in 1969. Note that the Scout Ranch will also be home to the Autumn Rallysprint on October 23rd. Black River Stages will be held September 18th and 19th in Harrisville, around 2 ½ hours away. Central New York Region used to organize this event and you can go up, volunteer, and see the action close-up.

ROAD RALLY

I hope that I can convince some of you to join us at the 44th Covered Bridge Rally, running November 6th at Stratton Mountain, Vermont. Ted Goddard puts on a fun ride geared to novices and experienced competitors. He always has a pretty course through the Vermont countryside, incorporating the covered bridges in the area and it is a perfect way to see how much fun rallying can be. It is also a swell way to take care of that promise you made to Significant Other to go on a "New England Getaway". Follow it up with a rallycross on Sunday in the parking lot at the Ski Area of Stratton.

The Pine Barrens Express is scheduled for November 20th in Central New Jersey. This rally





is impossible to describe other than it may be the most driving fun you can have going 15 mph on a straight road, running in deep sand. 10 mph driving on a tank trail trying to follow pie plates on trees. Can you say 6 instructions in 1/10 mile? Ever driven above a cranberry bog in the dark at 5 mph? We're still trying to figure out how the Jeep in front of us rolled at 32 mph on a straight two years ago.

Covered Bridge and PBX are great ways to tune up your team for the Winter Rally Series, conducted by the Finger Lakes Region on Saturday nights, presenting some of the best rallying in the country over five or so rallies down through the Lakes to the PA border.

And, should you get the rally bug in full, you will want to get invited to the Vermont Winter, John Buffum's annual all-nighter on snow and ice up in Burlington VT next Presidents' Weekend in February, a true reminder that "To finish first, first you have to finish".

The CNY SCCA SOLO Season update:

As we enter Event 7, trophy candidates shear away as they miss the required minimum number of events. 36 drivers remain, chasing 15 trophies. At the end of the night, that could fall to 21 drivers and 11 trophies, and it could also determine 8 champs.

Two championships have been settled: Street Mod was grabbed at Seneca Army Depot in Event 5 as Rob Sgarlata opened the points gap on Dan Cech. Mike Donofrio walked away with F125 Shifter Kart after a tall stack of donuts at Cherry Valley in Event 6, eliminating Ed Heffron.

Several drivers stand alone, with just one or two events separating them from clinches: D Stock's Ed Doherty in his bright red MazdaSpeed 3, G Stock's George Poniros as he considers what he might bring to the track next season, B Street Prepared's Jeremy Johnson running his second season in his WRX STI, E Street Prepared's Chris Carroll piloting his Camaro, D Modified's Leo Sawyer driving his very familiar Sabre 7, Street Touring S's Ed Leubner having fun in the sun in his Miata, Hollie Cartini on the brink of Junior Kart A, and Connor Hughes as he chases Junior Kart B.

As we enter the remaining battles, we find Mark Bizzozero in his car du jour holding James Quattro's Yaris back by seven points in H Stock. What will become of these coworkers might carry the odds of a coin toss!

In A Modified, Caye Mogle remains as the last and distant contender to compete with her father Richard as brother Jonathan and Lee Hidy are out of the points chase.

Novice class offers Kyle Adamo cleaning house in his Integra, eliminating Joe Sterling and his BMW at Cherry Valley, and only needing to fend off Travis Barnaby's WRX which he can do simply by finishing one more event.

E Modified shows Paul Kerestedjian in the lead with a perfect attendance tailwind. A fourth first place finish will take the trophy from the reach of Bill Meyers and Rex Franklin, whose defeat to



Tammy still leaves her short of points this season.

Perennial Street Touring favorite "Speedy Pete" Hirschey was threatened last season by Garrison Moseley whose engine let go, cutting short what would have been an epic battle. This season, a new menace has risen; Cody Gydesen is keeping Speedy Pete busy, all the while sitting on top of the stack in CNY's Rallycross series and from mechanical maladies recovering Christine-esque form. His car left him out of the battle for Cherry Valley, but Jesse Darrow and Joe Friel showed up in a Mazda Protege 5 to rough Pete up and keep Cody in contention. This one's going to the wire.

The most hotly contested class is the Pro class in its local debut season. Some of the region's most familiar faces and strongest PAX performers left their small classes to duke it out like rubber monsters trashing Tokyo. Event 6 at Cherry Valley has eliminated Joe Cosentino in his CRX and Nate Walczyk with his wildly driven Silverado, leaving six drivers standing. All six have plenty on the line in the remaining two races, as five still have open slots for scores and a different five have their lowest scores from Event 1 at the Fairgrounds, where Western NY gave us a quick lesson in speed.

Evan Haas and Dustin Ehrlich lead the pack in a pair of Subarus with a two point gap. Dustin is going to miss the 8th event at the Fairgrounds, so his last stand is with his nemesis, the night event at Cherry Valley. Karl Hughes trails Evan by only ten points, with a chance to drop a 0 and a 1.

Your Pro class longshots by the numbers include Charlie Elve, Garrison Moseley and Scott Newton,

all within three points of each other. While all three have odds at first in perfect storm fashion, the battle between these three will be worth watching.

The candidates for Top 10 in PAX are also whittling away. 27 drivers are in contention, but only 26 still have work to do to guarantee making the cut.

With only five events under his belt this season, Evan Haas has locked a top 10 spot. By the numbers, even if he skips the last two races, the worst he could do is eighth place. 35 points separate him from a guaranteed 5th place minimum, and a first place finish at Cherry Valley will assure him top spot for the season.

The seven drivers who are also eligible for first place are (in order of potential final points) Karl Hughes, Dustin Ehrlich, Pete Hirschey, Ed Doherty, Charlie Elve, Cody Gydesen, and Scott Newton. Dustin needs four points for a top 10 clinch, and Karl can reserve his seat with just 28.

If I had to choose five drivers most likely to also be top ten contenders, they would be Mark Bizzozero, Kyle Adamo, Mike Donofrio, Garrison Moseley, and Hollie Cartini. Kyle still has two blanks left to fill, giving him an advantage. Mark and Garrison will be building off of drops, hurting their progress but still leaving them plenty eligible.

However unlikely, if the stars are right, our top ten PAX finalists could be named at Cherry Valley, leaving the Fairgrounds to sort them out!

What will we see in the dark?
